Music Learning Organiser – Year 1 Autumn 1 – "How has education changed in Buckden?"

Prior Learning (What we already know?):

Taught a range of familiar songs and rhymes.

Rhythm – how to tap out a simple rhythm using body percussion and percussion instruments.

Names of instruments, how they create a sound and how to treat them respectfully.

Key Questions:

- What is this instrument called?
- Is this instrument tuned or untuned?
- Which instruments are you using and why have you chosen them?
- What do you like about your composition?
- What do you like about X composition?

Key Facts:

- Pitch is how high/low a sound is.
- Duration is how long/short a sound is.
- Dynamics are how loud/quiet a sound is.
- An ensemble is a group of people singing.

New Learning:

- To use body parts and tuned/untuned instruments to create a playground rhyme/song/chant.

- To compose a piece of music using tuned and untuned instruments.

- To showcase a piece of music to an audience.

New Skills:

- Take part in singing

- Follow instructions on how and when to sing/play an instrument

- Take notice of others when performing.
- Make and control long and short sounds (duration)
- Imitate changes in pitch high and low
- Vary dynamics (volume) as one way to show expression.
