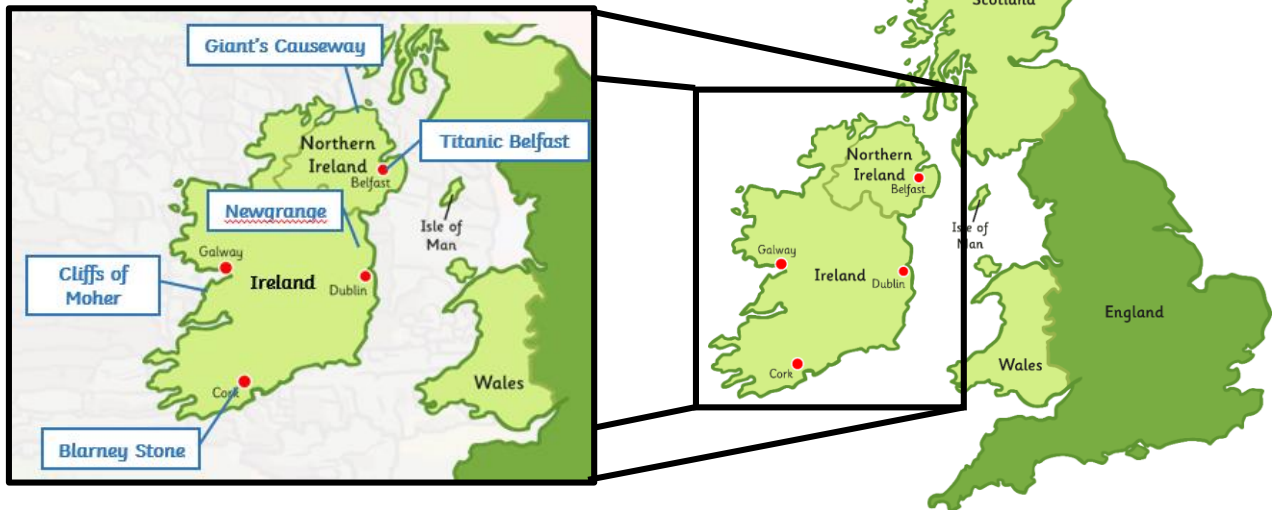


### The UK and Ireland

#### Newgrange



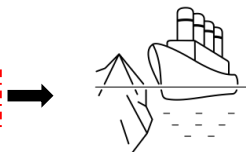
A stone Age monument constructed 5,000 years ago. An example of a early castle to protect farmers in the area.

#### Giant's Causeway



And area of 40,000 columns of rock, thought to be made by volcanic eruptions. A popular tourist attraction.

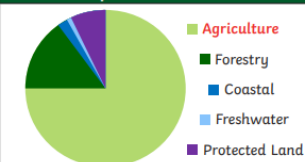
#### Titanic Belfast



A visitor attraction where the RMS Titanic was built. The area was ideal for ship making due to its deep, open water.

How Rural Space Is Used in the UK



$\frac{3}{4}$  of the land in the UK and Ireland is used for farming/agriculture

In Ireland, nearly all of the land is used for cow or sheep farming. This is because the land is hilly and soil is stony.
