What and where are the rainforests?





Around 60 million indigenous people still live in the world's rainforests and depend on it for their livelihoods.

Rainforests are home to over half the world's animals and plants.

A quarter of modern medicine contains ingredients from rainforest plants.

The plants of the rainforest provide 20% of the world's oxygen.

Every second, an area of rainforest the size of a football pitch is destroyed.

How can human activity affect ecosystems?





Human activity such as deforestation and burning of fossil fuels have an impact on the local and global ecosystems.

Population size is increasing across the world and the provision of resources increases the need for farming land.

Our world is getting hotter. This is called climate change.







Effects of climate change:

More frequent and powerful storms and floods

More drought

More hunger

Melting glaciers, sea ice and ice sheets.

Rising sea levels

Animals losing habitat and unable to survive

Fossil fuels are one of the main ways we produce electricity

but the carbon dioxide they produce contributes to climate change. Other contributors are:

Cattle farming

Deforestation
