Prior Learning (What we already know?):

We know the value of coins.

We may receive pocket money and know its value.

We know about food banks and their purpose.

We know that some people might have more money than others.

New Learning:

- 1. To know a definition of poverty
- 2. To understand in our community some people are very rich and some people are very poor.
- 3. To be aware poor people need to be resilient.
- 4. To be aware of the distribution of wealth across the world.
- 5. To understand conditions of poverty due to lack of food, poor sanitation and other losses of services.
- 6. To learn about what life is like for people living in poverty now and in the past.

New Global Development Skills and values:

- 1. To develop basic financial literacy skills.
- 2. To understand the safety of different places of keeping money.
- 3. To understand you can save money to spend a later date.
- 4. To promote/develop empathy, generosity & sharing, interest in engaging with others, & emotional well-being.
- 5. To place value on education and financial management.

Key Questions:

Were people rich or poor in the past?

How were poor people helped in the past?

Did food banks exist in the past?

Has money always been the same?

Can we eat healthily if we don't have a lot of money?

Half the world's people live in poverty.

Poverty is not just in other countries.

A workhouse is where poor people lived and worked for their keep.
