

RE Learning Organiser – Year 2 Autumn 1 – Creation - Who made the world?

Prior Learning (What we already know?):

- God created the universe.
- The Earth and everything in it are important to God.
- Humans should care for the world because it belongs to God.

Key Questions:

- Who created the universe?
Why is the world important to God and Christians?
Why should Humans care for the world?
How can Humans care for the world?

Key Facts:

The story of Creation opens the Bible. For Christians, Christians believe that God is the Creator. When they think about this, they want to thank God for all the wonderful gifts they have been given. Saying 'grace' at meal times is a more regular part of life for many Christian families — it reminds them to be thankful to God for all the good things, even the simplest things like food and drink.

New Learning:

God created the universe. Genesis 1:1–2:3 story.

The Earth and everything in it are important to God.

God has a unique relationship with human beings as their Creator and Sustainer.

What some Christian groups do to help care for the world God has created.
