

Types of primary sources

Photographs



Photographs were first invented in the 1830s. In 1950 black and white photos were the norm. By 1960 colour photography was more common. The first camera **The Brownie** was sold in 1900.



Journals/diaries /letters



Journals and **diaries** record a person's experience at the time of an event.

Sound recording



A sound recording is e.g. an historical voice, a famous speech, a recording of an event or an animal or person in time. Can hear recordings on a radio.

Newspapers



Newspapers were first printed in Britain in 1665. Newspapers take news around the world



Film



Film the first motion picture 1878. A film can record the details of an event or show us what things looked like or happened a long time ago, in the **past**.

Artifact (human made objects)




Artifacts can be found by an **archeologist** e.g. pottery or coins



Other artifacts could include, birth certificates, artwork, tools, maps, clothing and buildings.
