Celebrations Learning Organiser — EYFS Autumn 2 — "What and how do people celebrate here and around the world"

Prior Learning (What we already know?)

We know how we celebrate special occasions in our homes- birthdays, Christmas.

This half term we are learning to...

Roll, crawl, walk, jump, run, hop, skip, climb.

Learn to use a clay station using tools to create a product.

Beginning to form recognisable letters. Learning e r h b f ff l ll ss u, j v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th. Read tricky words 'l to no go into the'.

Recognise how people celebrate including festivals and celebrations from different cultures. Use this in role play.

Recognise the composition of numbers to 5 including using 5 frames. Counting to 20. Digit recognition to 10.

Perform a Christmas Nativity, learning songs, dances and script learning the bible story.
