Attendance Fact

At Key Stage 2 in 2022/23, pupils with 95-100% attendance were 1.3 times more likely to achieve the expected standard in reading, writing, and maths compared to those attending 90-95% of the time. Missing just 10 days in Year 6 can reduce the likelihood of reaching the expected standard by around 25%.
