Happy Friday Everyone!

A big thank you to everyone who came and bought books at the book fair last Friday after school and at the PTA Winter Fair on Saturday. We raised a lot of money for the school so that we can purchase new books, we hope the children will enjoy reading them!











Last week, across the school we recognised Anti-Bullying week. Below are some examples of the learning that took place amongst the children.



- In Reception the children learnt more about what bullying actually is and then celebrated our friendships made by saying thank you to our friends with gifts and cards.
- In Year 1 the children talked about the importance of being kind and respectful to everyone we encounter.
- In Year 2 the children focused upon including everyone.
- Year 5 looked at the different roles people play in facilitating a bully and even if you are not the main instigator, you still have a part to play. We reinforced the idea that we need to stop bullying dead in its tracks.
- Year 6 marked anti-bullying week by taking part in a class assembly all about the difference between banter and bullying. We identified when banter and joking is appropriate and when it tips into bullying. The discussions in both classes were fantastic and the children recognised when they would like joking with friends and when this joking could become unwanted.

With our learning we made the links to the following articles from the <u>UNISEF Rights Respecting Curriculum!</u>

ANTI-BULLYING

Article 2 - Non-discrimination The Convention applies to every child without discrimination, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status, whatever they think or say, whatever their family background.

Article 12 - Respect for the views of the child Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right always applies, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.

Article 19 - Protection from violence, abuse and neglect Governments must do all they can to ensure that children are protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect and bad treatment by their parents or anyone else who looks after them.



We feel it's important that the pupils at Buckden CofE Primary School have the opportunity to participate in The Big Ambition survey and have their say.



The Big Ambition provides a much-needed opportunity for the children of England to tell political decision makers what is important to them ahead of the General Election. Their responses will be shared with Government to ensure that children's voices are heard.



This is a great opportunity to teach children about politics and why it is important for them to use their voice!






The Flu Vaccination Team are visiting us on Wednesday 6th December.
