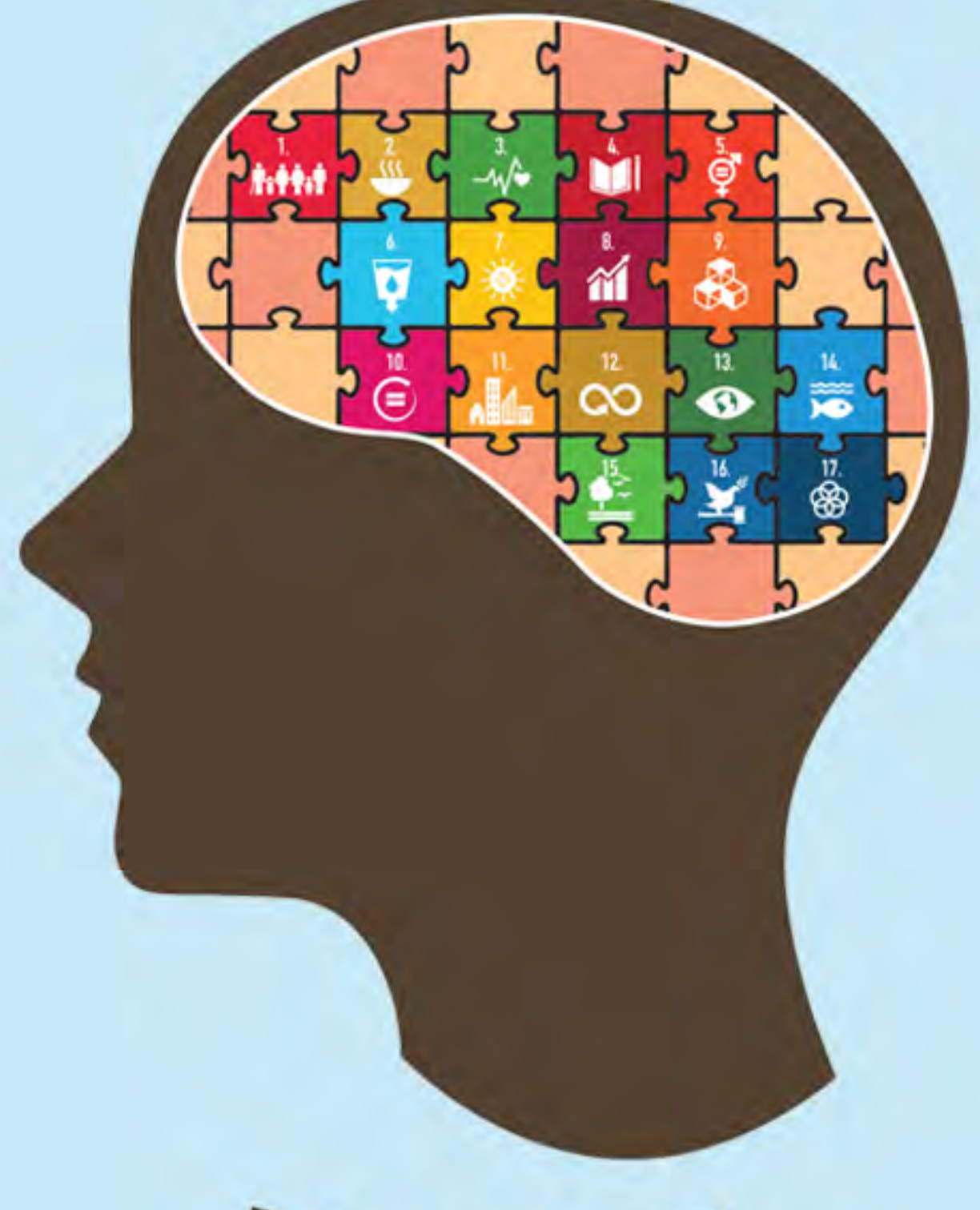
Happy Friday Everyone!
